

CREATING ORNAMENTS AND HANGERS

THESE ARE NOT STAND-ALONE DECORATIONS.

If you have matching bobbin threads I suggest you use those so the back looks good. I sewed them out with white to make sure they would look ok and they do.

Hooping/Stabilizing Instructions for the ornaments/hangers, hoop 1 or 2 layers of wash-away stabilizer with 1 layer of Crinoline Tulle so that the patterns are actually sewn over the tulle. When they are sewn out trim as close to the edge as possible without cutting the threads. Soak them for a few seconds in hot water and let dry. When dry trim any loose edge stitches being very careful not to cut the satin stitch outline. If they are not laying flat, Iron between 2 pieces of fabric or paper so the starch doesn't get on your iron (You can use spray starch if they are not stiff enough). If you like some sparkle to your ornaments using a glue stick put glue where you want some sparkle and sprinkle some glitter over the glue area.

The individual patterns that are not in a frame can be sewn out on any article of clothing or Christmas décor you choose. They would all be cute sewn out on pillows or any décor, article of clothing or what every project you likeZ.

The colour choices on the sheet are from the brothers extended list but the actual sew-out colours are your choice.
