

JHB428 ITH Paisley Coaster Set freebie

Thank you so much for downloading this freebie. I am sure you are going to enjoy making it. It is an in the hoop project and your choice of thread colours are purely going to depend on your choice of fabric. The inside detail of the pictures will not be the same as that of the freebie design as it is for one of the coasters in the set, but the procedure of making the design is the same.

For this project you are going to need

Fabric for the top

Fabric for the lining

Quilters batting or compressed batting

Thread for the line detail

Thread for the paisley design

Satin stitch outline colour, here you need to match your top and bottom thread

Avalon Plus (water soluble vilene) as a stabilizer

Hoop up a double layer of Avalon Plus cross hatched.



Thread up your machine with your satin stitch outline colour, matching your top and bobbin thread. When I do line work, I like to match my top and bobbin thread for every colour, it just gives you a nicer stitching line with no fear of your bobbin thread showing at the top.

Stitch the first colour line directly onto the stabilizer. This is a placement line of where your batting is going to go.



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Float your batting over the placement line and holding it lightly in place so that it does not move or bubble, secure it with the next colour line, which is a double run stitch line.



Remove hoop from the machine, but not the design out of the hoop, and cut away the excess batting close to the run stitch line. You do not want any fuzzies.



Now float your top fabric, right side up, over the batting area and secure with the next colour line. Again lightly holding your fabric in place so that it does not move or bubble.

This is a single run stitch line. DO NOT cut away any excess fabric at this stage.



Now change your thread to the colour you are going to stitch the line detail of your coaster in and then stitch the line detail. Then change your thread colour to the colour you wish to stitch your paisley design in and proceed to stitch that as well.



Change your thread to your satin stitch outline colour, matching your top and bobbin thread.

Float your lining underneath the machine, right side facing away from the machine.

You can of course pin your lining in place from the top of the hoop outside the stitching area or you can tape it in place underneath the hoop. Choice is yours.



Proceed to stitch the next colour line. This is a run stitch line and a zigzag line.



Remove hoop from the machine, but not the design out of the hoop, and cut away the excess fabric on top of the hoop as well as underneath the hoop.



Place the hoop back on the machine and stitch the final satin stitch outline.



Carefully cut out of the stabilizer. Wash out the stabilizer and dry flat. Once dry, lightly press on the reverse and you are ready to use your coaster.
